

## **SEAPAC-Kingfisher Monitoring Summary and Case Resolution**

During the 6-month period from 01 July 2021 through 31 December 2021, OceanMind carried out fisheries compliance monitoring using VMS data of 10 Thai-flagged fishing vessels that regularly supply to SEAPAC-Kingfisher Holdings Ltd and agreed to be monitored under this programme.

During the monitoring period, OceanMind identified and provided recommendations to support follow-up investigations into Potential Non-Compliances (PNCs).

The majority of fishing trips made by these vessels flagged no major compliance issues, and vessels showed very high levels of compliance. Most of the PNCs were due to gaps in VMS transmissions, which were investigated, and the vessels were confirmed to have remained in port and reported VMS gaps according to the relevant regulations. Therefore, all cases in monitoring reports have been settled and are considered closed.
