

## SEAPAC-Kingfisher Monitoring Summary and Case Resolution

The SEAPAC-Kingfisher Holdings Ltd are regularly supplied by 10 Thai-flagged fishing vessels between January 2024 – July 2024 and 6 Thai-flagged fishing vessels between August 2024 – December 2024. These vessels agreed to be monitored on the Vessel Monitoring System (VMS) for fisheries compliance by OceanMind.

During the monitoring, OceanMind identified and provided recommendations to support follow-up investigations into Potential Non-Compliances (PNCs).

During the 12-month period from 01Jan2024 -31Dec2024, the majority of fishing trips made by these vessels demonstrated high levels of compliance. For this monitoring period, only 3 PNC were reported. These PNCs are related to two events of VMS gaps inside the Thai Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) and one event of slow speed transmissions outside the Thai EEZ. OceanMind requested the Thai-Department of Fisheries to investigate the reason for the VMS outage. All cases related to satellite's transmission and system problems. Therefore, all cases in the monitoring reports have been settled and are considered closed.
